1 Welcome

AC welcomed everyone to the meeting, after the Opening Ceremony of Specialist Centre (SPC) earlier in the morning.

2 Minutes of Last Meeting

The minutes were confirmed and approved.

3 Matters Arising

3.1 MYP 2015 results – HB had circulated by email KdW's report on apparent discrepancy of 2015 data.

4 Primary Block Extension Update

The college is now waiting for final approval from the Government, for the rooftop's occupancy, expected later in February 2018. (Note after meeting: OP granted on the 28th of February 2018)

5 **Principal's Report**

JD presented results from the standardized assessment in the primary school (PIPS). College students are doing well, results were in line with other ESF primary schools. (JD's powerpoint attached).

HB spoke to his report previously circulated.

On staffing, HB reported that there will be 23 leavers, 12 primary and 11 secondary, including 3 promotions to overseas schools, 4 vacancies remain to be filled.

HB proposed and Council approved an additional FE counsellor, bringing the team up to 3 to serve over 300 IBDP students.

The next CIS/WASC/IB visit will be in September 2018.

JD briefed Council on the CIS/WASC/IB evaluation visit and conducted a survey of council members' involvement as the college's governing body, which is part of the evidence required by the external evaluation team. He will circulate more information to Council members prior to the next meeting.

<u>Business Manager's report</u> – SH spoke to his report previously circulated.

- the next Finance committee meeting will be held at ESF Centre before the next Council meeting on 22 March.
- ESF has given the green light to review the outsourced cleaning service now costing \$2.8M, with 11 daytime and 11 night time cleaners deployed. It is proposed that it would be more economical as well as fair, to directly employ the 11 daytime cleaners as RCHK staff. The cleaners would have better salary & conditions and work better with a greater sense of belonging to the college. The estimated cost of directly employing the 11 cleaners was 2.7M. AC commented that this could proceed provided the College can manage the additional staff. SH assured Council that the HR manager and Facilities Manager can manage this and are keen to support the proposal. (Note after meeting: As it was found that 5 out of 11 of the cleaners are above 60 years old, this project is abandoned.)
